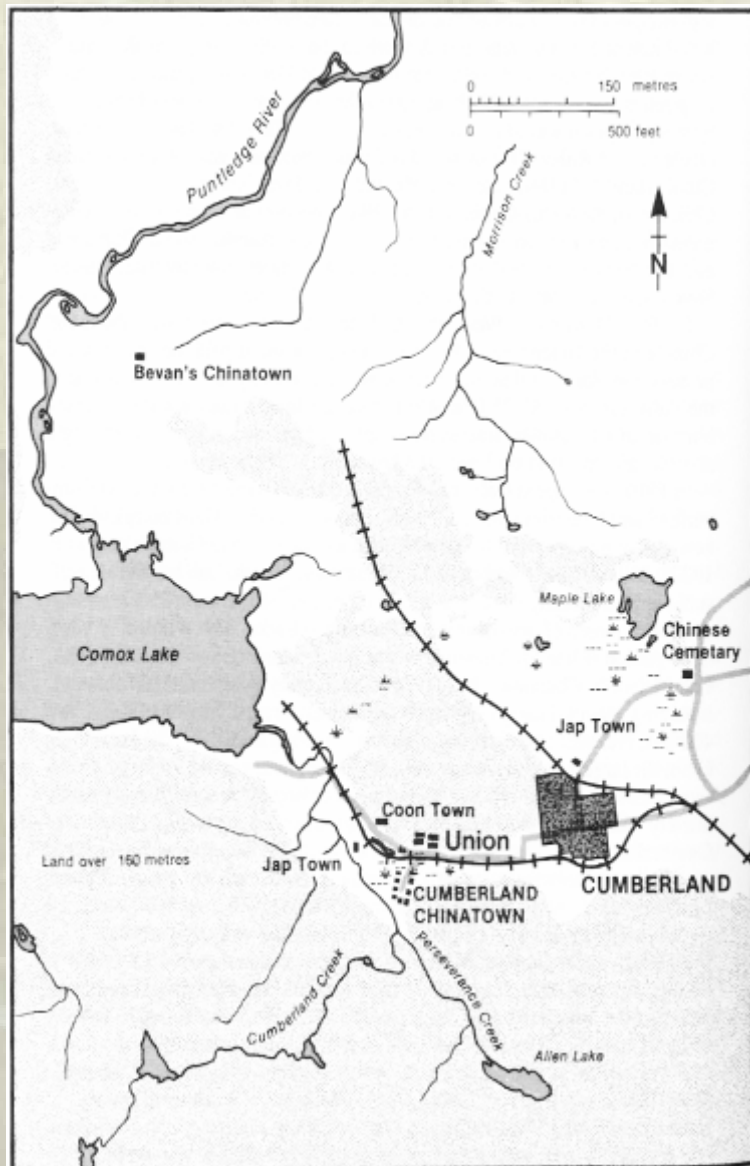

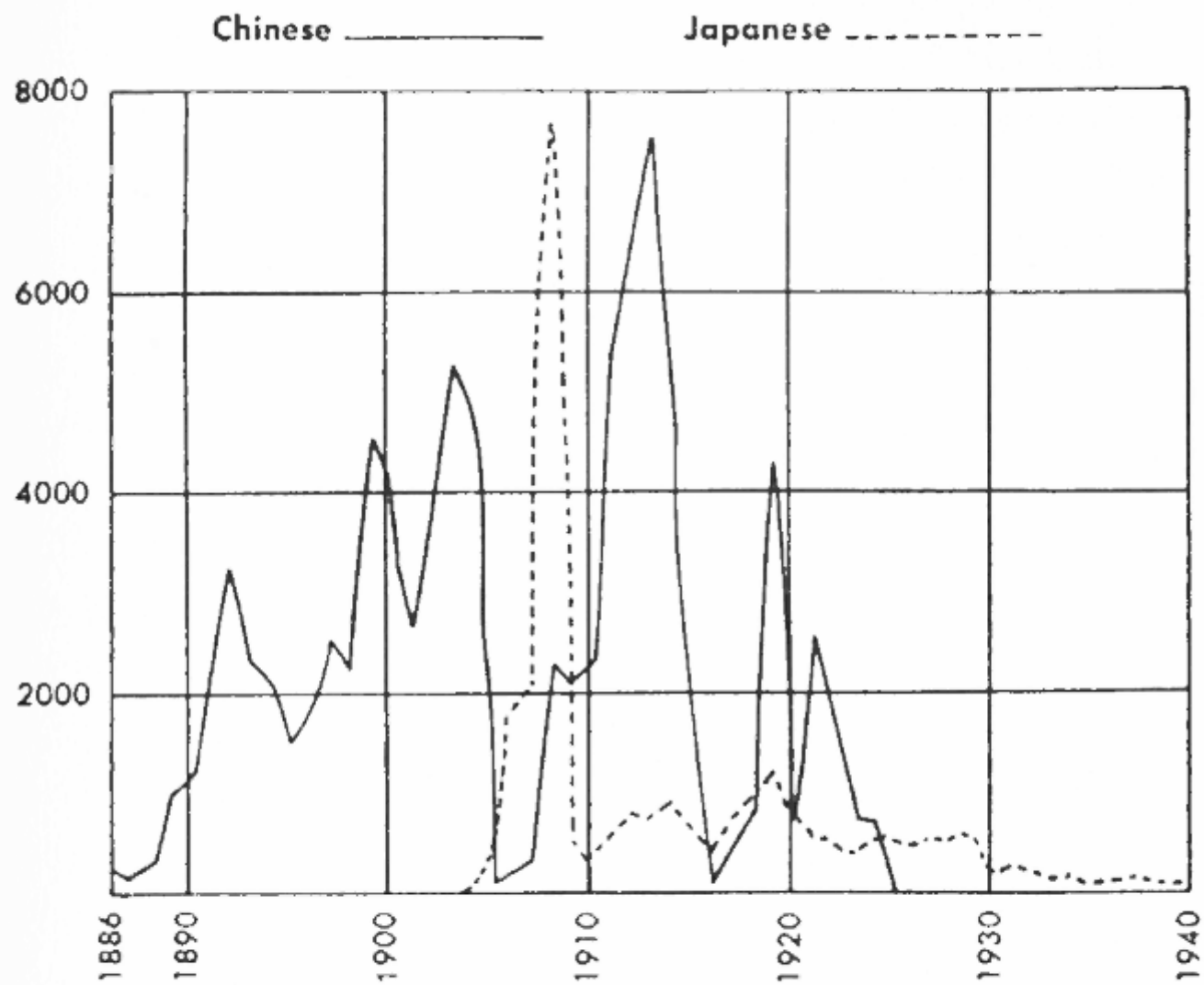


Cumberland and environs, 1900s

CHINESE AND JAPANESE IMMIGRATION INTO CANADA

Restrictive Legislation directed at Chinese Immigrants

1885	Head tax - \$50
1901	Head tax - \$100
1904	Head tax - \$500
1923	Chinese Immigration (Exclusion) Act

Highlights of “Gentlemen’s Agreement” of 1907 (Hayashi-Lemieux)

Classes of emigrants permitted to emigrate:

- previously residing in Canada, including wives and children
- engaged by Japanese residents in personal or domestic service
- contract emigrants; contract approved by Canadian Government

Limits Japanese immigration to 400 per annum male labourers and domestic servants

Revised Agreement of 1928

“... the Government of Japan does not contemplate that the total number of emigrants to Canada, including agricultural labourers and domestic servants, and **wives and children** of Japanese emigrants resident in Canada, will exceed a total of **150 annually**. We have further been informed that steps will be taken to terminate the practice of sending for so-called ‘picture brides’.” (1928 *Debates*, quoted by Woodsworth 1941:296)

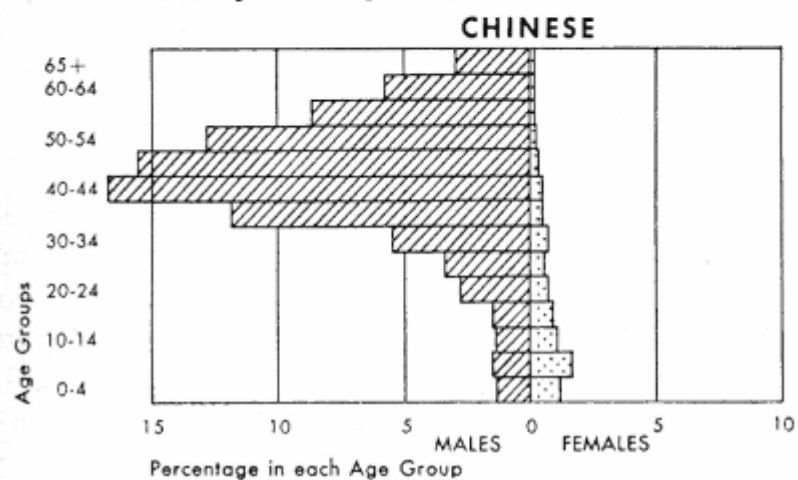
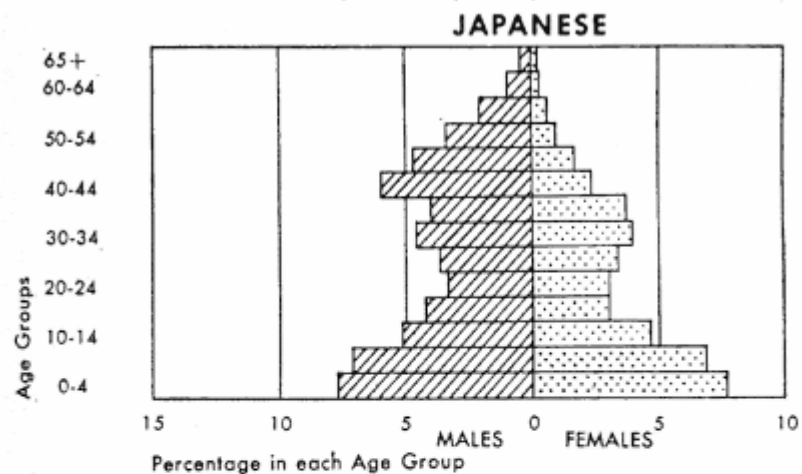


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AGE PYRAMIDS

(Census of 1931)

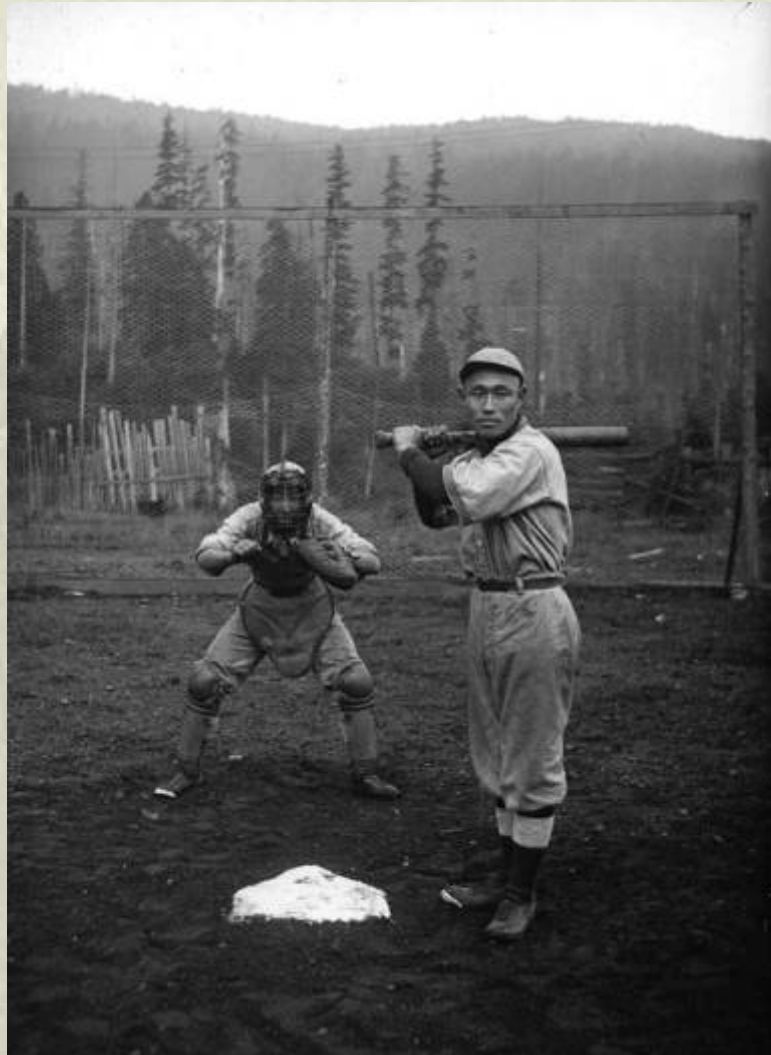
